Recipes from Old World Wisconsin

Soft Molasses Cookies (Siirappikakut)

Finnish Ketola Farm

1/4 C	Shortening/lard	2-3/4 C	Flour
½ C	Dark Brown Sugar	½ t	Salt
½ C	Hot Water	1 t	Cinnamon
½ C	Molas es or honey	1 t	Ginger
1	Egg	1 t	Cloves
		½ t	Baking Soda
		1 t	Baking Powder

Cream shortening and sugar together. Combine hot water and molasses. Stir into the fat mixture, along with the egg. In a separate bowl, blend dry ingredients together. Slowly add to the fat mixture, stirring until just combined. Drop spoonfuls of dough onto baking sheets and bake at 350 F for 10-15 minutes.



Sour Cream Cookies

Norwegian Kvaale Farm

2	0	Current
4	С	Sugar

3 C Flour

1 C Butter Eggs, beaten 1/3 t Salt ¹/₂ t Cream of Tartar

- 1 C Sour Cream
- Baking Soda, dissolved in 1 tsp. hot water 1 t

Cream together sugar and butter, add eggs and stir well. Mix together flour, salt and cream of tartar. Sift into wet ingredients. Stir baking soda/water mixture into the sour cream. Add to the batter, stirring until just combined. Drop spoonfuls of dough onto baking sheets. Bake at 350 F for20-25 minutes, or until the edges are light brown.




Polar Star August Book Club Selection
