
This event is our main fund raising event for the year and replaces our September Lodge Meeting.





President Johnson called the meeting to order following a 1:30 p.m. Pioneer Polse Piknik luncheon.

President Announcements:

- Ken opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance, and welcomed everyone.
- Paul Thomason was introduced. He recently visited Norway, and has just joined our Polar Star Lodge.
- There were no objections to the April meeting minutes.

Treasurer Report: Carol read a summary of the monthly Treasurer's report (copy attached). Current checking account balance is \$13,490.36, and our total assets \$28,102.47. Motion to approve the report was made, seconded, and passed.

Sports Director Report:

- Jerri Lynn reported that 53 people have signed up for the October 4th Slooper Fun Walk.
- She talked about our August 4, 2024 to Oct 5, 2025 immigration virtual walk from New York City to Norway, IL, and reminded everyone to keep walking.
- Diana Raimond completed the 836 mile walk. She was awarded a pin for being the first finisher, and was given a
 very nice, soft blanket. Diana agreed that all of her mileage for the remaining months of our virtual walk will go to
 Floyd Anderson, who has been in and out of Edward Hospital and Marianjoy Rehabilitation Center over these last
 months.
- Everyone agreed that each walkers' surplus miles will go to Floyd.

Social Director Report:

- We need to begin baking for our 4 big upcoming events:
 - Oct 3-4-5 Cultural Weekend Event
 - September 7 Vasa Park
 - November 2 Hostfest
 - December 7 Christmas Julefest
- Nancy stressed that our October Cultural Weekend Event is a very important historical event, celebrating the 200th anniversary of the very first *organized* Norwegian immigration: the 1825 immigration of the "Sloopers".
- For the Oct 3-4-5 Cultural Weekend, we need to bake goods that won't spoil (for example, cookies and bars). Nancy plans to make simple cakes (without whipped cream, etc.)
- The Norwegian American newspaper had 18 photos; 4 of those photos were from us. They also published Dave Johnson's Oslo Syttende Mai Parade picture.

Cultural Director Report:

• So far, 81 people have signed up for our Cultural Heritage Weekend event.

- Barb announced that while she and Ken were in Stavanger, Norway in July, President Ken actually stood on the
 deck of the Restauration sloop replica, standing by haddock drying on a traditional rack. She also said that
 Jeanne and Craig Leifheit will be in New York City to see the Restauration arrive.
- Wow between seeing the Restauration launched in Stavanger Norway, seeing it arrive in New York after its long voyage across the Atlantic Ocean, and planning and hosting our October Cultural Heritage Weekend celebration, our Polar Star lodge is well represented in this important historical event celebration!

Meeting Adjournment: After adjournment, we all went outside. To participate in the 2025 District 5 Lodge Throwing Competition. Barb Johnson developed a throwing game called "Pioneer Picnic Team Tossing". There were three teams, 5 people per team, and five different things to toss: rubber "cod" fish, Kubb batons, axes, stars, and fjord horse heads. Two rounds were played, and the team with the most points earned gold medals. Fun was had by all. The weather was terrific!
